Performances

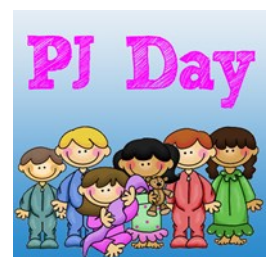
Congratulations to Year 5 and Year 1 for their lovely performances. It has been a challenge in many ways but hopefully the children have enjoyed the experience and the parents too.

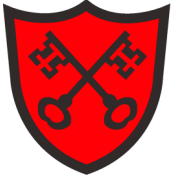
