Ash Wednesday Service

Our thanks to Father Paul for leading us in the service. It was a pleasure to see the children very engaged in his Homily and being so respectful waiting for their ashes. It was also good to see so many parents join us.

Lenten activities

We are delighted to welcome Victoria Goodman from the Church Schools of Cambridge who will be leading the children in Lenten workshops in the coming weeks. The first is on the 7th March and it will be Godly Play on Lent and the other will be on the 30th March about Holy Week.

We are also pleased that our friends from GenR8 will be leading the much loved assembly on Lent on the 20th March. At the end of the term 31st March, Father Paul and the Chaplains will be leading Stations of the Cross for each class in KS2. Parents will be very welcome to join their class at the specified times. Lenten Walk

The children will be starting their weekly 1km walk next week. The money they raise will go straight to the Cafod, Turkey and Syria Earthquake Appeal. Follow <u>this link</u> if you would like to donate. When you do so, please complete the Sponsor Form which the children are bringing home today. When the children bring the form back they will receive a sticker to show they have "Told Others". By the end of the term all the children who have completed the 5 week walk (1000km+ for the school) will receive a certificate.

Closing gates

A reminder that the gates will close at 8.55 am every morning. At the end of the day the gates will close at 3.30pm, including the side gate beside the Parish Centre (City Kids). Any child attending an outdoor after school activity will be dismissed from the playground gates at the parish centre or on Union Road. If your child attends an indoor after school club they will be dismissed from the front entrance ie Music school, Latin and Italian clubs. Irish dancing is the only exception as the children will be dismissed via the Parish Centre gate by the Dance Leaders because older children will be coming for the later session.
