Rosary

Next week, all the children will be given a set of Rosary Beads, as we will be saying a decade of the Rosary each day during the month of May. Each decade will be followed by the Fatima prayer. Attached is a pamphlet to help you at home. It describes each Mystery and the Prayers of the Rosary.

Attendance

At the recent Governors' meeting the attendance of each class was discussed. It was agreed that if the attendance figures do not improve for the rest of the term, families will be referred to the Educational Welfare Officer and Fixed Penalty Notices will be issued. This is the practice in most Cambridge schools and we have held off because our attendance figures have been good. Although our attendance (95.4%) is above the national (93.9%) to date, this is below the target set (96.2%).

The government's expectation of primary school attendance is 96%.

Year 5 and 6 Girls Football Competition

On Tuesday 25th April, 10 girls from Year 5 and Year 6 took part in a Girls Football Competition at Coleridge Secondary School.

120 girls from 13 schools took part in the 7-a-side competition. The St Alban's team won 3 out of their 6 matches, scoring at least 1 goal in 5 of the games and coming 7th overall in the competition. The girls played fantastically well throughout the competition, demonstrating positive team work and great determination against some tough opponents.

SATs / Assessment week

This begins on the 9th May. The weekend before is the Coronation and bank holiday. Please ensure the children are rested, especially Year 6.

Strike Action

The school has managed to keep all the classes open during the strike action. However, next Tuesday there may be an increase in the number of staff involved in the strike and we will not be able to keep all the classes open. We will therefore have to prioritise "vulnerable" children, as we did during Covid. We are not yet in a position to tell you which classes will need to be closed.

Coronation Day

Next Friday the children are invited to come dressed as Kings or in Red, White and Blue. During the day the children will receive a lesson on the Coronation.

Invacuation Drill

This week, the children took part in an "Invacuation Drill". They were briefed beforehand about why we needed to practice this and they were very sensible and calm during the drill. Well done to all children and staff involved.


